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- ❖ The Hilbert School District is located in Calumet County, between Lake Winnebago and Lake Michigan-north of Fond du lac, south of Green Bay, east of Appleton and west of Manitowoc.
- ❖ Hilbert High School enrollment for 2017-2018 is 146.
- ❖ The school year is divided into four quarters. GPA and class rank is determined by semester. There are 8 periods in the school day.
- ❖ Grades and GPA are not weighted. This includes AP and dual credit courses.
- ❖ AP/Dual Credit Courses offered: Calculus for Advanced Placement; ENGL 101:English Composition-CAPP; ENGL 150: Intro to Literature-CAPP; Oral/IP Communication-TC; Written Communication-TC; Economics-CAPP; MS Office-TC; Accounting I&II-TC; Welding II-GMAW Techniques-TC.
